

Meeting November 7, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 5:37 pm by SHAC coordinator, Lillian Ramos. The meeting took place at the LFISD Curriculum Building.

The SHAC committee voted on Ms. Leticia Sanchez, parent of WB Green, as the secretary for the SHAC committee.

Ms. Sara Saldivar, School Nurse Coordinator, reviewed informational items addressing staff wellness, the District Webpage, and Health Screenings. She also provided information about the Cameron County Public Health Services. La Feria ISD will continue working towards the 100% goal for all 2024 graduation seniors regarding Intrac Immunizations.

Mrs. Nancy Loredo, Family and Community Engagement Coordinator, also reviewed the activities the district is conducting to promote wellness, employee health, and community health.

Coach Campos, Girls Athletic Coordinator, reported to the SHAC that the subcommittee would be meeting in December to review aligning PE activities from Kindergarten to 6th grade. She also reported that in January, our District will participate in Marathon Kids. Marathon Kids challenges our students to run, jog, walk, or move the equivalent of four marathons throughout a season. PE instructors will engage in this challenge and will also be introduced to the ACE Program.

Ms. Thania Parra from It's Time Texas discussed the Community Challenge for the district beginning in January. Ms. Parra also discussed how It's Time Texas will be supporting the LFISD Wellness Policy Goals that were approved.

Ms. Ramos, SHAC Chair, reported to the SHAC committee on HB 3144, HB 3908, and SB 629. Regarding HB 3144, it was discussed how LFISD provided activities on Fentanyl Poisoning Awareness.

HB 3908 was reviewed, and it was recommended that research-based instruction on fentanyl abuse prevention and drug poisoning awareness be proposed to the board. The SHAC committee reviewed lessons and activities from Operation Prevention. SHAC recommended that Operation Prevention be presented to the LFISD School Board as a recommendation for research-based instruction on fentanyl abuse prevention and drug poison awareness. SHAC members unanimously agreed.

Senate Bill 629 was discussed on the importance of establishing requirements on how to maintain, administer, and dispose of Opioid Antagonists.

The next meeting date has been scheduled for January 2024. The meeting was adjourned at 6:35 pm.
